Seminars are application-oriented and offered in block formats that allow students to remain in their ministry settings. #### **FLEXIBLE**

Courses are offered year round in a unique trimester schedule. Workshops are 2-4 days in length and are required to be taken on campus. Seminars are 3 days in length and can be taken on campus, at extension centers, or through SYNC.

Every seminar is designed to reflect the needs of the church and other Christian ministries. Each student is challenged in every class to generate strategies relevant to their personal ministry setting and apply them to their local context.

#### APPLY

Step 1 | Complete the application request form. Visit "Admissions and Readmissions" at nobts.edu/cme

Step 2 | The Professional Doctoral Programs office will guide you through the application process.

Step 3 | Application approval by the ProDoc committee.

#### DEGREE PHASES

Program Overview and Research Writing Workshop is taken in the first trimester.

Mid-Career Workshop is taken after completing half of the required seminars.

Project in Ministry Design Workshop is taken after all seminars are completed.

#### NO MDIV/M.A.C.E?

Applicants desiring to pursue a professional doctoral degree whose master's degree is not the required ATS prerequisite degree may consider doing equivalency work in order to qualify for the program.

All equivalency work must be satisfied completely before an application to a professional doctoral program can be considered. However, this does not guarantee admission.

Prospective applicants should contact the Professional Doctoral Programs office first to inquire about the various possibilities for attaining equivalency.

#### **TRANSFERS**

Up to one half of the student's seminar credits may be transferred from another institution

- •9 hours for DMin
- •15 hours for DFdMin

#### **SEMINARS**

Seminars can be taken at the main campus or at extension centers. A third option is via individual participation (SYNC).

SYNC allows students to take seminars from individual devices anywhere. SYNC requires an ethernet connection and headphones with a microphone.



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
