

- Author's name
- E-mail and phone number
- Title of paper
- Institutional affiliation
- Degree program (<u>required</u> to be entered into paper competition!)
- Full paper of approximately 3,000 words (no longer than 25 minutes to read) plus Abstract (100-200 words)
- Days and times you <u>prefer</u> to read the paper and days and times you <u>cannot</u> read the paper. Sessions will be held **November 13-15**,
 2018 at the Sheraton Hotel in Denver, CO. Winner <u>must</u> be able to read the paper at the national meeting. Preference may be given to students with flexible schedules.

Dissertations Due March 1

If you are planning to submit your dissertation by March 1, please let the ReDOC office know if you have not already done so (e-mail is fine). The <u>Program Materials page</u> has all the necessary forms:

- Dissertation Processing Notebook
- ThM/PhD Graduation Application link

All parts of the dissertation should be submitted by the deadline, including dedication and acknowledgments, if any.

Applications for the ThM only are due by February 15. Students planning to submit dissertations can apply for graduation as late as March 1.

An IRB request and a pdf of a prospectus for research using human subjects must be submitted to the guidance committee chair, who must forward them to redocsec@ nobts.edu, indicating permission to proceed, no later than one month prior to the meeting at which the prospectus will be considered. See the Program Materials page for the form and details.

A prospectus to be considered submit a hard copy of the by ReDOC must be reviewed by your guidance committee and 9 copies submitted through your chairperson to the Office of Research Doctoral Programs no later than one week before the scheduled ReDOC meeting. Prospectuses for research involving human subjects must be received one month before the meeting.

Likewise, matters such as directed study proposals and requests to take courses at other institutions must be submitted one week before the ReDOC meeting at which they will be considered.

Also e-mail a **pdf** of the prospectus or directed study proposal to phd@nobts.edu. Do directed study approval page.

Please keep in mind that final approval of your prospectus is granted by your doctoral guidance committee after you make any revisions your committee deems appropriate in light of feedback from ReDOC.

If you are required to go through the Institutional Review Board approval process for research with human subjects, your committee cannot approve your prospectus until the IRB assesses the risk to and protection of the participants.

The maximum length for the prospectus is 30 pages of text plus the selected bibliography.

NOTE: If you think your guidance committee has approved your prospectus but you have not seen your approval in the ReDOC News, please let us know.



Khalil Habib teaches in the Department of Philosophy and directs the Honors Program at Salve Regina University in Newport, Rhode Island. After receiving an MA in Political Science at the University of Toronto, he went on to obtain his PhD in Philosophy at Boston University (2006). Professor Habib's teaching interests include classes on Islamic philosophy as well as ancient, medieval, and modern political thought. He is the editor of a collection, *Cosmopolitanism in an Age of Globalization: Citizens without States*, which contains his own contribution on "Ibn Tufayl's Critique of Cosmopolitanism in Hayy Ibn Yaqzon." Other publications range from essays on the Greek comic poet Aristophanes to Machiavelli and Tocqueville, and the 14th-century Arabic thinker Ibn Khaldun.

The Scott M. Gibson Emerging Scholars Grant

From its founding in 1997, the Evangelical Homiletics
Society has been committed to cultivating rising scholars in the field of homiletics. This Grant honors Dr. Scott M. Gibson, cofounder and first president of the Society.

The Emerging Scholars Grant is a means for the Society to assist and encourage developing scholars to fund their education. Awardees of this grant represent the best in current graduate educational scholarship in homiletics.

SCHOLARSHIP DETAILS ARE AS FOLLOWS:

- This scholarship is open to all Associate Members of the Evangelical Homiletics Society enrolled at the PhD level of graduate study
- The submission must focus on research regarding a relevant issue in homiletics
- The length of the research will be 15,000 20,000 words, follow the current JEHS style guide for articles
- The target readers are evangelical professors of homiletics
- The student must submit the research to ResearchScholarship@ehomiletics.com by the stated deadline of APRIL 30, 2017
- A jury of EHS members will evaluate the essay "blindly" based on relevance to the teaching of biblical preaching and the EHS confessional statement, and determine a recipient
- The Board will notify the students of the decisions at least 90 days prior to the EHS annual conference
- The awardee is expected to attend the EHS annual conference
- Recipient will be recognized at the annual Evangelical Homiletics Society conference, may be given an option of
 presenting the research during the Evangelical Homiletics Society annual conference and possibly published in a
 future issue of the The Journal of the Evangelical Homiletics Society

Cash scholarship of first place is \$2,000, plus registration fees and meals to attend the EHS conference. Travel assistance to the conference may be available.

The submission deadline is 30 April 2018.

Can You Dig It? The Gezer Water System Expedition 2018

May 25-June 15, 2018 \$650* per week + Airfare

*Extra days: \$100/day

Sponsored by The Moskau Institute of Archaeology/Center for Archaeological Research of New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary and the Israel Nature and Parks Authority

The Project: Participate in the excavation of an ancient Canaanite water system at Tel Gezer in Israel.

Dates: May 25-June 15, 2018. Volunteers should plan to arrive no later than May 25, and those working all three weeks should plan departures for June 15.

Cost: \$1,950 for the 3-week season, or \$650 per week (extra days: \$100/day) + airfare. Costs cover room, board, and weekend travel. Preference will be given to three-week participants. Participants are responsible for their own flights to and from Israel. The dig will arrange airport pickup.

Weekend Travel: The expedition will arrange several field trips covering key areas of Israel. Weekend travel costs are included in the excavation pricing.

Accommodations: Volunteers will be housed in airconditioned rooms at the Neve Shalom Guest House, with three to four persons per room.

Academic Credit: Undergraduate or graduate course credit for up to 6 semester hours is available. Additional tuition fees apply. For details, contact Shaun Grunblatt (sgrunblatt@nobts.edu).
