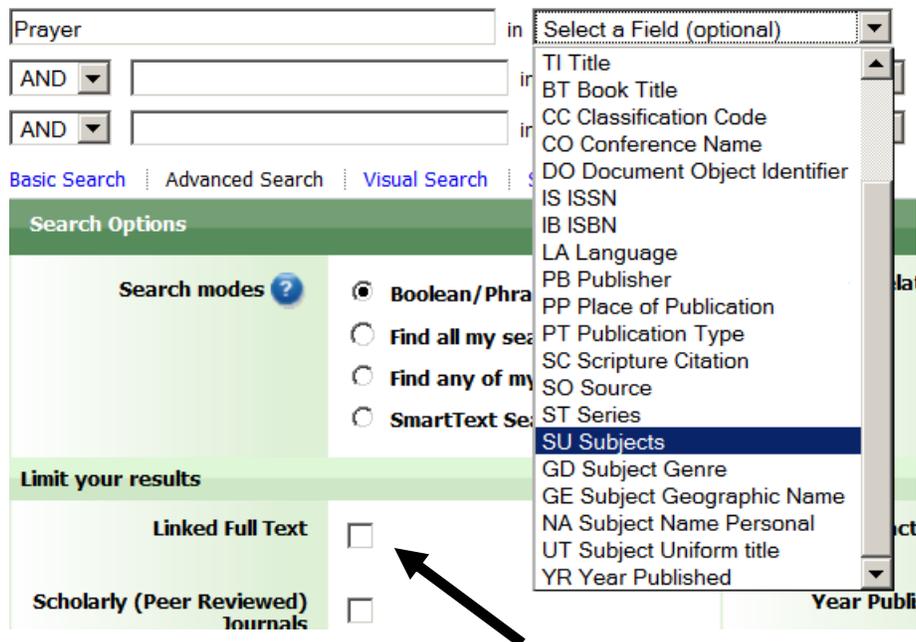
## Introduction

This is your primary access to nearly 50 databases where you can search for journal articles, essays, book reviews in academic disciplines including theology, psychology, biblical studies, social work, etc.

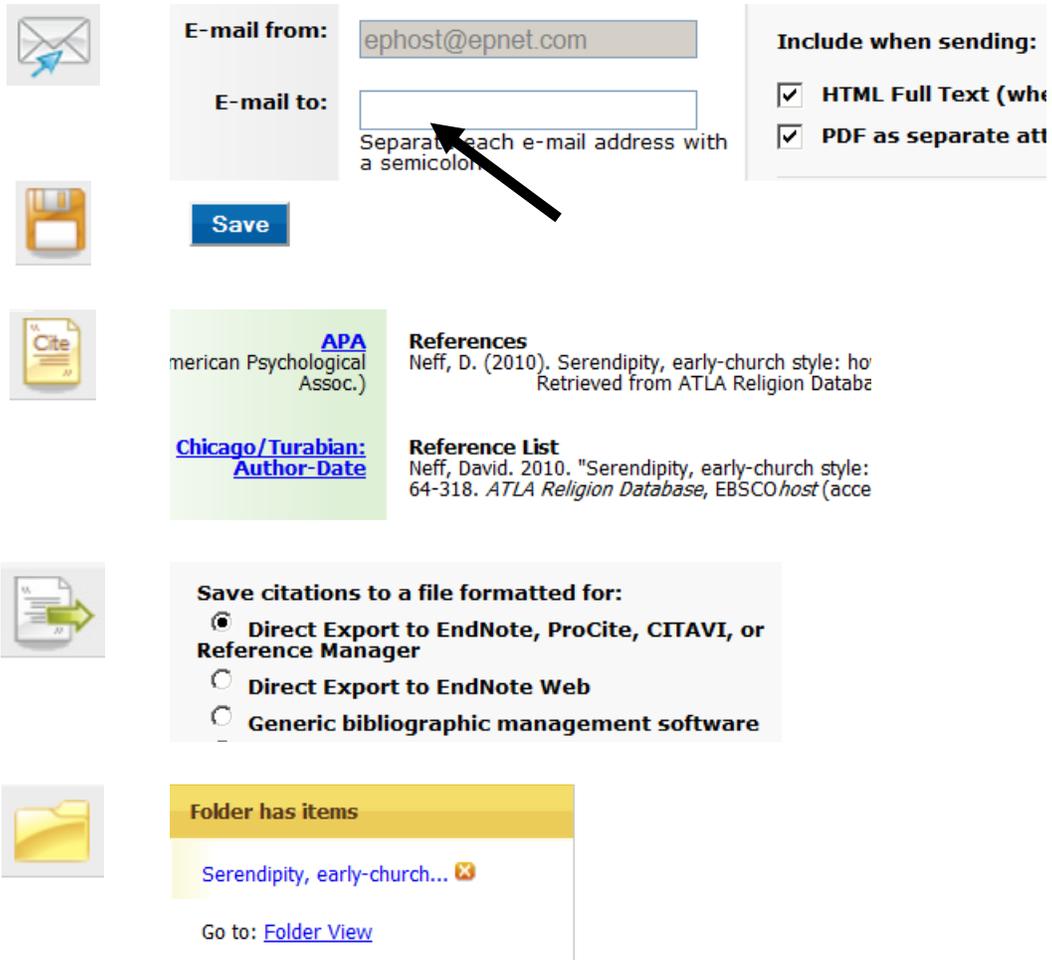
**1. Select the Database link and select which database(s) you want to search, then “Continue.”**
