Executive Summary

We had no direct data for MABA students in our last assessment period, so we have nothing with which to compare the current data. We are setting benchmarks that we think will be reasonable for the future. We are removing metrics based on the Systematic Theology 1 class, because this class is no longer required for the degree. We are also recommending the addition of a thesis to the degree. Students will now be assessed based on the thesis and not the Research and Writing course. We feel this is more in line with expectations in the field of archeology.
