Executive Summary:

The M.A. (Philosophy) is still a relatively new degree plan at NOBTS, and its Assessment Map was just revised in Fall 2023. In addition, long-tenured professors in the discipline have recently retired, and the new program coordinator has been on faculty for just over a year. It is also worth mentioning that several assessment measures (e.g., all Direct Measures except the last one) have very limited data sets to compile and interpret. Hence, while it appears that all assessment benchmarks were met or exceeded, the changing context makes it difficult to draw any significant conclusions from the data.

As leadership of the MA(Phil) transitions, there are a number of actionable items stemming from this year's assessment process.

- (1) A grading rubric to be developed for the PHIL 6330 (History of Western Philosophy) embedded assignment. Responsible faculty: Program Coordinator (Dr. Anderson) in consultation with faculty of record (Dr. Dew and Professor Oakley).
- (2) A grading rubric to be developed for the THSE 6300 (Theological Research and Writing) embedded assignment. Responsible faculty: Faculty of record (Dr. Bandy) in consultation with MA(Phil) Program Coordinator (Dr. Anderson).
- (3) A grading rubric to be developed for the PHIL 6301 (Philosophical Theology) embedded assignment. Responsible faculty: Program Coordinator (Dr. Anderson) in consultation with faculty of record (Dr. Stewart).
- (4) Remove DISC 5300 embedded assignment as a direct measure for SLO #3.
