EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Positive Reflections

The committee would like to congratulate the Church Music Department on accomplishing a range of suggestions from the previous academic jury. These include but are not limited to the replacement of a very subjective reflection paper for Theology of Worship with a substantially more objective multiple choice/True-False questions on the final exam; the adding of 6 hours of electives, which was suggested in the previous academic jury summary; the improvement of technology in the Sellers technology lab; and as noted above, the Theology of Worship assignment was improved to move toward more "reliable and valid measures" of student learning outcomes; the determination of a direct measure for Planning and Leading Worship, namely, a multiple choice/True-False set of

questions (the updated version of Planning and Leading Worship will be taught for the first time in the Spring of 2025).

Regarding positive results that are related, at least indirectly to the student learning outcomes, a student can enter and complete the MAWM program without an undergraduate in music and without being required to complete leveling work.

A student may complete the degree as a distance student.

A need for curriculum changes, along with a reference to ongoing curriculum reviews were specifically noted in the previous academic jury. For example, the previous academic jury noted under an indirect measure item related to "range of experiences" that a curriculum review anticipated the adoption of elective hours in the MAWM program. These elective hours were indeed included in the revised MAWM curriculum adopted in the Fall of 2022.

Although the suggestion from the previous MAWM academic jury that a MAWM degree program survey replace the previous degree program indirect measures that would no longer be used, this specific suggestion did not occur. However, an equivalent replacement was found that allowed the Church Music Department to view responses from MAWM graduates only, namely, the GSQ survey referenced under various outcomes in the program assessment grid above.

Perhaps most importantly, the core classes for the MA in Worship were changed in a curriculum overhaul that was officially adopted in the Fall of 2022.

Negative Reflections

Regarding weaknesses that are related to student learning outcomes but not addressed in the jury, there is a concern overall that a significant number of distance MA Worship students appear to be struggling with at least two key academic areas, New Testament and Spiritual Formation.

Regarding the quality of technology delivery, particularly for live music making and technology particulars related to music and worship, the current delivery system is not adequate and thus could be affecting student perceptions of their ability to "conduct worship/liturgy."

Additional Action Plans

Although the updated version of Planning and Leading worship has not yet been taught, the professor scheduled to teach this class plans to include creative projects among required assignments.

Regarding the process of gathering data, the jury is suggesting that the Church Music Department not only disaggregate by section type (e.g.., NOLA2ULive versus regular hybrid), but also demonstrate that only MA Worship student scores are included in the direct measures for classes that are unique to the MA Worship degree.
